The Proposal

There is a shortage of extra care housing accommodation nationally, and locally in the Solihull area. Shirley Aquatics is an ideal site for care home accommodation as it would create an attractive living environment set in landscaped grounds.

Two care homes are proposed. The smaller two-storey building will be built on the location of the two existing houses currently on the front of the site. This new building would comprise 12 beds.

The larger building to the north will be built in the location of the glasshouses, retail and car parking area. It would comprise 75 beds accommodated within a 2-3 storey building. This linear building would be centrally located within the site, following the shape of the site and set well in from the site boundaries.

The existing access into the site from Stratford Road would be retained close to the south eastern boundary of the site and parking would be provided within the site.

Most of the existing mature trees will be retained within the site, primarily along the boundaries. A woodland garden and walkway for the residents is proposed close to the northern and northeastern site boundaries.
